Are Foreigners On Your Computer?

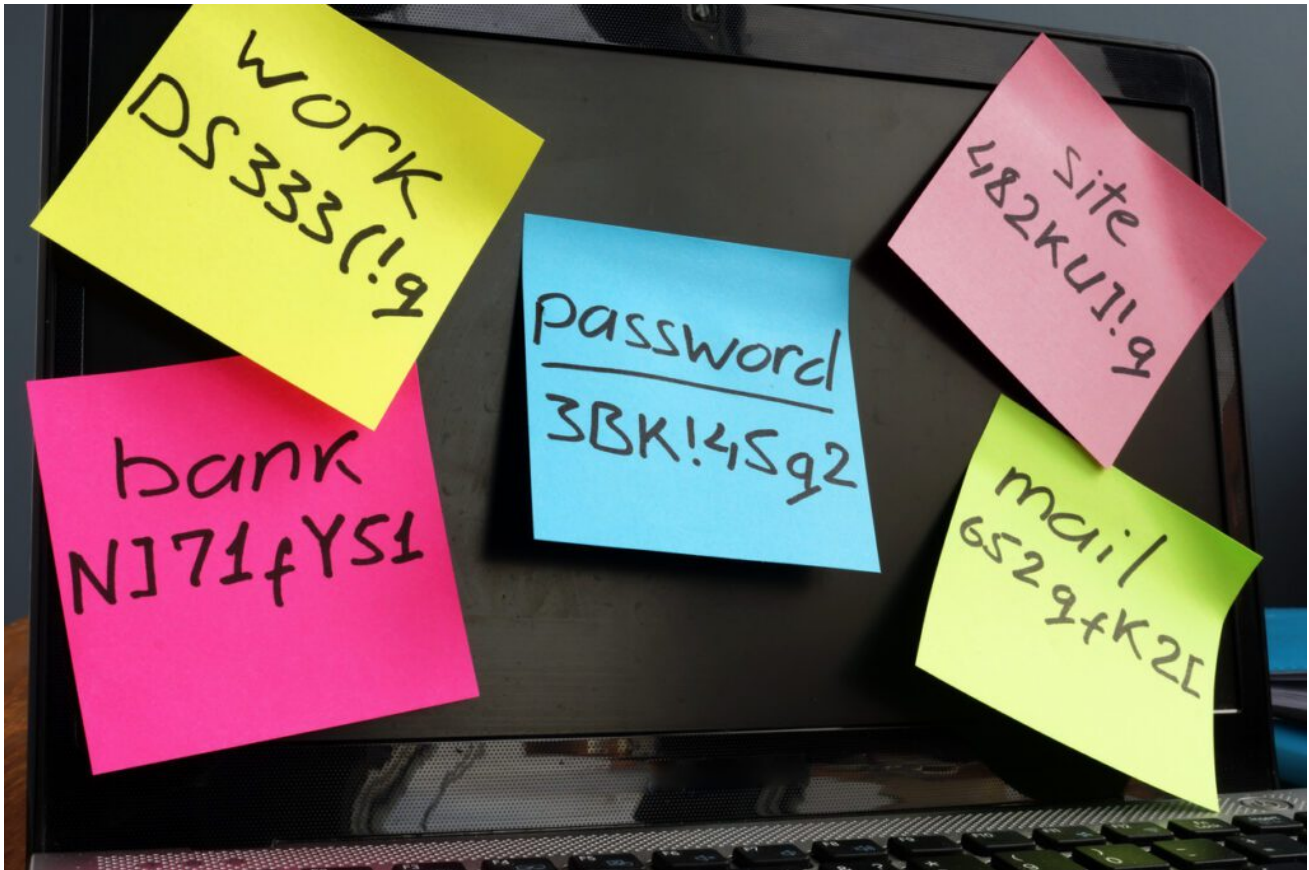
