Question of the Week

Question: "Do you remove my cookies when you do the Quarterly Update? Just wondering." (Note: the Quarterly Update is part of our Remote Technical Support service. If you're not familiar, please visit www.4kcc.com/rts.)

Answer: This is a question we hear frequently. Our answer is always the same. We don't remove cookies and we actually don't encourage you to remove them, either.

If you Google or Bing "computer cookies," you'll find advice from everyone and anyone. "Cookies are bad!" "Always delete your cookies!" On and on it goes. Instead of taking advice from people who really don't know what they are talking about, why not read what we have to say!

First, let's define what computer cookies are and what they do.

A cookie is a small file often placed on your computer when you visit a website for the first time. Cookies contain wee bits of information and take up little space on your computer's hard drive. Cookies are used to store information about you to help identify you on a particular website.

For instance, have you ever visited a website, signed up by putting your name in a field and then finding that the next time you visit that same site, it has text that reads "Hello, <your name>"? A cookie makes that happen.

For those of us who run websites, we like cookies because it distinguishes a first time visitor to our site from someone returning. When you delete cookies and visit a site you've been to before, the webmaster thinks you're a new visitor. By the way, the webmaster can't see your name or other personal info when you visit a site, he or she just sees that your computer either didn't have a cookie (new visitor) or already had a cookie (return visitor.)

Are cookies bad and should you delete them? The answer to this question is what I lovingly call "The Microsoft Answer" - it depends! Generally, I say leave cookies alone. I can't even tell you the last time I deleted cookies from one of my computers. However, if you get a "bad" cookie and strange or nasty things start happening, then you should clean out cookies - if not all of them, at least the ones put on by a "bad" site.

(Example: I had a customer last week who logged into Remote because naked Russian women were appearing on her screen. She had accidentally landed on a

"bad" site which put a cookie on. We cleared the cookies and all was well.) Here's a few final things you should know about cookies: one website can't read another website's cookie; the method for clearing (deleting) cookies varies based on which browser you are using; "tracking cookies" are cookies placed onto your computer by third-party advertisers to gain insight into what types of retail items you might want to purchase. These tracking cookies can be both helpful and annoying! Again, these cookies can always be deleted if you find them intrusive.
