Question of the Week



Question: "In the answers to the quiz from a few weeks ago, you stated that it's not necessarily safe to open email attachments from people you know. I always thought it was safe. Why are you saying that?"

Answer:

It's true - unless you are specifically expecting an email attachment from someone you know, you shouldn't open the attachment. Why? There are multiple reasons for me saying that. (I'm not alone, by the way. Almost all online security experts will tell you the same thing.)

First, a great majority of people use easily hacked passwords to protect their email accounts. While this might make remembering your password simpler, it also opens your account up to quick and effortless hacking. A hacker can get into a poorly protected email account and send to everyone in your address book. As I mentioned in my blog post "Old Rule Out, New Rule In" you can't even depend on scanning an attachment with your anti-virus.

Second, hackers will often hack one of your friends' email accounts and steal the address book. Then, they will send emails to those in the book using email addresses which are very similar to your friend's real address. Unless you're paying close attention, you might click on the attachment before you notice the "From" email address is different. By then, it might be too late. As an example, I received an email where the beginning of the address was the same as one of my customer's email address but it was at a different domain. I won't use his real name but here's an example: 4kcccustomer@comcast.net (the real email address) and 4kcccustomer@gmail.com (the fake email address).

Finally, it's possible that someone you know will have their entire computer hacked and the crook will send emails from the person's real email account, attaching something bad.

In conclusion, this is a mindset thing. You need to change your thinking from "it's okay to open attachments from someone I know" to "it's only okay to open attachments from someone I know if I'm aware ahead of time that it's coming."
